<p>What is the overall <a href="#">deductible</a>?</p>	<p><b>In-Network: \$250</b> Individual <b>Non-Network: \$5,000</b> Individual</p> <p>An individual within a family shall not have a deductible that is more than the individual <a href="#">deductible</a> limit. **To satisfy the In-Network family deductible, three family members must each meet their individual deductible.</p>	<p>Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <a href="#">providers</a> up to the <a href="#">deductible</a> amount before this plan begins to pay.</p>
<p>Are there services covered before you meet your <a href="#">deductible</a>?</p>	<p>Yes. <a href="#">Preventive</a> care services, physician visits, and mental health and substance abuse counseling are covered before you meet your <a href="#">deductible</a>.</p>	<p>This <a href="#">plan</a> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <a href="#">deductible</a> amount. ### Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? **Yes**
